YMCA furloughed and current employees that require financial assistance may apply for finance assistance from our partners at **Ceridian Dayforce**. Our employee sponsored charity, Ceridian Cares, gives grants to individuals and families in need. Examples of What Ceridian Cares supports include grants for food, clothing, footwear, and household items. We provide assistance for medical devices, home adjustments for barrier free living, and recreation programs for individuals and families in need. How To Apply:

Are you or someone you know in need of assistance from Ceridian Cares? Here’s what to do:

1. Review the Ceridian Cares Application Criteria: <https://www.ceridiancares.com/evaluation.html>

- Please note that Ceridian Cares will not provide grants to the same recipient in consecutive years.

2. Gather all the required documents:

- Recipient’s US birth certificate or permanent residence card.
- Two quotes/estimates from vendors or service providers for the cost of the item(s) for which financial assistance is being requested.

- Optional: Letter from third party to support your claims (e.g., doctor, teacher, social worker, therapist, etc).

3. Once you have the all required documents, follow the steps below to apply:

- Click on the “Apply Now” button.
- Fill in all the required fields of the Grant Application Form.
- Scan and upload all the required documents.
- Click “Submit”



UI Claims and Adjudication Centers (Claims Takers)
A *UI Professional I* is a contractual position. This entails working in one of the Claim Centers within the Division of Unemployment Insurance involving obtaining detailed, technical information from claimants in order to establish and process UI claims, and to detect potentially disqualifying UI issues.

Adjudicate potentially disqualifying UI issues in accordance with established guidelines to provide high quality customer focused services that regulate the distribution of UI benefits to support the economic stability of the state.

UI Tax Professional
Ensure compliance with State UI Law as a Contributions Specialist, responsible for contacting liable employers to collect delinquent UI reports and payments of taxes, interest and/or penalties. Determine the liability of employers to pay Maryland UI Contributions. Service all employers whether liable and/or not liable. Investigate and respond to employer inquiries concerning their accounts.
